Nyrada Annual General Meeting – Letter to Shareholders

Sydney, 19 October 2020: Nyrada Inc (ASX: NYR) ("Nyrada" or the "Company") advises that an Annual General Meeting ("AGM") will be held at Level 5, 126 Philip Street, Sydney, NSW 2000 and will also be made available to Shareholders electronically <u>through a virtual meeting at</u> 10.00am (AEDT) on Thursday, 19 November 2020.

COVID-19 Modifications

Given the significant health concerns attributed to the COVID-19 pandemic, in addition to guidelines and restrictions issued by Australian state and federal governments, the Company considers that it is appropriate to also hold the Annual General Meeting as a virtual meeting accessible online. Although Nyrada is incorporated in Delaware, USA, this is in a manner that is consistent with the temporary modifications to the Corporations Act 2001 (Cth) introduced by the Commonwealth Treasurer.

Under the Company's By Law and Delaware General Corporation Law, the Notice of the AGM ("Notice") is being made available to Shareholders electronically and can be viewed and downloaded online at the following link: <u>https://www.nyrada.com/site/investors/asx-announcements</u>

Given the uncertainty surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic, by the time this Notice is received by Shareholders, circumstances may have changed but this Notice is given based on circumstances as at 19 October 2020. Accordingly, should circumstances change, the Company will make an announcement on the ASX market announcements platform and on the Company's website at https://www.nyrada.com/site/investors/asx-announcements. Shareholders are urged to monitor the ASX announcements platform and the Company's website.

All resolutions will be decided on a poll. The poll will be conducted based on votes submitted by proxy and at the Meeting by shareholders who have indicated that they intend to vote at the Meeting in accordance with the instructions set out below.

Questions and Answers

What is the purpose of the Annual General Meeting?

At the Meeting, Shareholders will be able to vote on the Resolutions set out in this Notice of Meeting. Holders of CDIs may instruct CDN to vote the Shares underlying their CDIs by following the instructions on the CDI Voting Instruction Form. The Company will also provide Shareholders and CDI Holders with the



opportunity to ask questions during the Meeting in respect to the formal items of business as well as general questions in respect to the Company and its business. The Resolutions outlined in the Notice of Meeting include the following:

- the re-election of John Moore as Director (Resolution 1);
- the re-election of Peter Marks as Director (Resolution 2);
- the re-election of Christopher Cox as Director (Resolution 3);
- the re-election of Marcus Frampton as Director (Resolution 4);
- the re-election of Ruediger Weseloh as Director (Resolution 5);
- the election of Ian Dixon as Director (Resolution 6);
- the approval of issue of Incentive Options to Ian Dixon, Director of the Company (Resolution 7); and
- the approval of 10% capacity to issue equity securities under Listing Rule 7.1A (Resolution 8).

Who is entitled to vote at the Annual General Meeting?

Only those Shareholders of record or beneficial owners of Shares held in Street Name (as defined below), at 7:00PM (AEDT) on Friday, 6 November 2020 (**Record Date**) will be entitled to vote at the meeting and any adjournment or postponement thereof.

As at the Record Date, there are 109,383,722 Shares of Class A Common Stock outstanding (equivalent to 109,383,722 CDIs), all of which are entitled to vote with respect to the Resolutions set out in this Notice of Meeting, subject to applicable voting exclusions. Therefore, there is currently a total of 109,383,722 votes entitled to be cast at the Meeting.

Each Share of Class A Common Stock is entitled to one vote per Share. Each CDI represents 1 Share of Class A Common Stock.

Votes for, against and abstentions will be counted as present and entitled to vote for the purposes of determining whether a quorum is present.

Will any Shareholders be excluded from voting on any of the items?

In accordance with ASX Listing Rule 14.11.1, the Company will disregard certain votes cast on certain resolutions by certain persons.

Voting exclusions apply for Resolutions 7 and 8, as set out above in the Notice of Meeting.

The table below notes the Disclosure of Interests in relation to all Resolutions

Disclosure of Interests for Resolutions 1-8

In accordance with the Delaware General Corporation Law, the following disclosure of interests is advised:

Resolution 1: Mr John Moore, as at the date of this Notice of Meeting, holds 230,000 CDIs and intends to provide instructions to CDN to vote in favour of this Resolution.

Resolution 2: A related party of Mr Peter Marks, Shanti Capital Pty Ltd <Peter Marks Super Fund A/C>, as at the date of this Notice of Meeting, holds 50,000 CDIs and the related party intends to provide instructions to CDN to vote in favour of this Resolution.

Resolution 3: A related party of Mr Christopher Cox, Symphony Capital Holding LLC, as at the date of this Notice of Meeting, holds 800,000 CDIs and the related party intends to provide instructions to CDN to vote in favour of this Resolution.

Resolution 6: A related party of Dr Ian Dixon, Altnia Holding Pty Ltd Pty Ltd <I Dixon Family A/C>, as at the date of this Notice of Meeting, holds 9,921,725 CDIs and the related party intends to provide instructions to CDN to vote in favour of this Resolution.

Resolution 7: A related party of Dr Ian Dixon, Altnia Holding Pty Ltd Pty Ltd <I Dixon Family A/C>, as at the date of this Notice of Meeting, holds 9,921,725 CDIs. Further to the voting exclusion statement for this resolution, this related party is unable to vote on Resolution 7.

How many Shares must be present for voting to hold the Meeting?

Pursuant to Article I, Section 4, of the Company's Bylaws, the holders of one-third of the capital stock issued and outstanding and entitled to vote at the Annual General Meeting must be present in person or represented by proxy shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Shares are counted as present at the Annual General Meeting if:

- the Shareholder of record on the Record Date attends the Meeting in person or virtually; and
- the Shareholder of record on the Record Date, or the applicable beneficial owner, has properly submitted a proxy in a timely fashion as set out in this Notice of Meeting.

What is a proxy?

If you designate another person or entity to vote Shares that you own, such other person or entity is referred to as your proxy. If you designate someone as your proxy in a written document, that document is also called a proxy or proxy card. When you designate a proxy, you may also direct the proxy how to vote your Shares. This is referred to as your "proxy vote".

What is the difference between a Shareholder of record and a "Street Name" holder?

If you own Shares registered directly in your name with the Company's US share registrar, you are considered the Shareholder of record with respect to those Shares. As a Shareholder of record, you have the right to grant your voting proxy directly to the Company or to vote in person at the Annual General Meeting.

If you Shares are held in a stock brokerage account or by a bank, trust or other nominee, then the broker, trust or other nominee is considered to the Shareholder of record with respect to those Shares, while you are considered the beneficial owner of those Shares and you Shares are held in street name (**Street Name**). Street Name holders generally cannot vote their Shares directly and must instead instruct the broker, bank, trust or other nominee how to vote their Shares. Since a Street Name holder is not the Shareholder of record, the Street Name holder may not vote their Shares in person at the Annual General Meeting unless such holder obtains a legal proxy from their applicable broker, bank, trustee or nominee giving such holder the right to vote the Shares at the meeting.

CDN is the Shareholder of record for all Shares beneficially owned by holders of CDIs. Holders of CDIs are entitled to receive the Notice of Meeting and attend the Annual General Meeting and may direct CDN to vote by using the method described in the CDI Voting Instruction Form.

What does it mean if I receive more than one printed set of proxy materials?

If you receive more than one printed set of proxy materials, it means that you hold Shares registered in more than one account. To ensure that all of your Shares are voted, please submit proxies or voting instructions for all of your Shares.



Can I vote my Shares in person at the meeting?

Please note that due to ensuring appropriate social distancing, physical attendance at the AGM will be limited to the Board of Directors and company management. The Company therefore requests shareholders to attend the meeting <u>virtually</u> to avoid the disappointment of not being able to attend in person.

Therefore, you may only vote your Shares in person at the Annual Meeting by registering and participating in the virtual online facility if you own shares of Class A Common Stock or CDIs and are a Shareholder of record on the Record Date. CDI Holders may vote the Shares underlying their CDIs by submitting their properly completed CDI Voting Form and lodging it with the Company by the due date and in a manner as set out in this Notice of Annual Meeting.

Even if you currently plan to attend the virtual meeting and vote your Shares at the meeting, we recommend that you submit a proxy so that your vote will be counted if you later decide not to attend the meeting. If you submit your vote by proxy and later decide to vote in person at the Annual Meeting, the vote you submit at the Annual Meeting will override your proxy vote.

If you are a Street Name holder of Shares, you may vote your Shares in person at the meeting only if you obtain and provide to Automic prior to the meeting a signed letter or other form of proxy from your broker, bank, trust or other nominee giving you the right to vote the Shares at the meeting.

How do I vote my Shares of Class A Common Stock?

Shareholders are entitled to vote if they are a Shareholder on the Record Date regardless of whether they attend the Annual General Meeting.

At the Annual General Meeting, every holder of Class A Common Stock present themselves or by proxy, is entitled to one vote for each Share of Class A Common Stock held on the Record Date on all matters submitted to a vote to the Shareholders.

If you are a Shareholder of record, you can vote in any of the following ways:
